

OLD BLACK COLONY ROAD - OPEN HOUSE MEETING

This report presents a summary and analysis of the Old Black Colony Road Open House held in person on Wednesday, September 27, 2023 and the virtual open house held from September 27 to October 8, 2023. The purpose was to collect community feedback on the proposed improvements and preliminary designs planned for Old Black Colony Road.

PROJECT OVERVIEW


As part of the voter-approved 2021 Buda Bond Proposition A Projects, the City of Buda plans to make improvements to Old Black Colony Road from FM 1626 to west of Cole Springs Road. Improvements include roadway reconstruction, drainage upgrades, and adding sidewalks and bicycle lanes to enhance bike, pedestrian, and vehicle mobility.


OPEN HOUSE MEETING

On September 27, 2023, the City of Buda hosted an in-person open house at Buda City Hall and invited the public to learn more about the project and share feedback through a comment card available in-person and online. The same information was available online as a virtual open house and the comment period was open from September 27 to October 8, 2023.

COMMENTS SUMMARY KEY TAKEAWAYS

The community was able to share their feedback on preliminary designs and planned improvements for Old Black Colony Road. There were 7 comments received. Overall, there was a general agreement that improvements are needed and below are additional common themes.

Key themes we heard from the community:

- Concerns for impacts to trees, driveways, and personal property
- Concerns for safety, current speed of traffic, and congestion
- Questions on intersections
 - Participants emphasized the immediate need for a signal at FM 1626
 - Roundabout operation discussions
- Questions on timeline and access during construction
- Desire to preserve and honor the history of the area
- Interest in plans for Old Black Colony east of project limits
- Respondents mentioned ongoing concerns with drought conditions and water supply
 - o Concerns about city using landscape products that depend on water
 - Concerns about increased flood risk

PROMOTION

The open house was promoted through mailed letters to property owners, emails to stakeholders, postcards to surrounding neighborhoods, yard signs, social media posts, and press releases.

Property Owner Coordination

On August 22, 2023, property owner letters were mailed out to property owners adjacent to the project Old Black Colony Road to share information on the project and offer meetings with the project team to discuss potential impacts. The project team met with 12 property owners prior to the open house.

Postcard

On September 8, 2023, postcards were mailed to 226 residents in surrounding neighborhoods on Old Black Colony Road.







Email to Stakeholders

Email notices were shared to promote the meeting and comment period:

- September 18, 2023 A save-the-date email was sent to 26 stakeholders, including homeowner associations and property owners.
- October 6, 2023 A reminder of the open comment period was sent to 293 stakeholders to encourage feedback through the online comment form.





Yard Signs

8 yard signs were placed at intersections in surrounding neighborhoods such as Whispering Hollow, Summer Pointe, and Elm Grove.



Social Media

The City of Buda promoted the open house and encouraged community feedback through their Facebook and Instagram.

On September 19, 2023, the City of Buda issued a press release sharing information about the open house and encouraging public participation.
